Covid Update for members and friends of NCC following government briefing.

Implementation date from 19th July 2021

In view of the government's decision to lift most of the restrictions around Covid 19, we, Rev Mark and the Elders and Deacons would like to assure members and friends of NCC that we intend to continue to maintain a safe and positive environment for us to worship.

We will do this by updating our Risk Assessment which will include the following principles:

- We will continue to maintain a **register** on Sunday for **Track and Trace**, although we will not insist on people booking in for a meeting or service. New people attending should make sure they have given their contact details. Anyone entering the building other than Sunday morning will still be required to sign in the book by the side door or on the front table. This is very important. CCTV is also in place and captures people's arrivals and departures.
- **Windows and doors** will be opened where possible during services/ meetings and fans used when the weather is warm. This will be reviewed as the weather gets cooler.
- **Signage** will continue to be in place to encourage and remind people "Hands, Face, Space", although social distancing will not be mandatory.
- Regular **cleaning** will be done between hall users and the 99.9% bacterial disinfectant spray will be used on chairs and touching points between users and during regular cleaning. More anti-bacterial spray could be made available for touch points, for all hall hirers to use.
- We will ensure there is plenty of **hand sanitiser** and will still encourage those coming into the building to sanitise their hands.
- The wearing of a **mask** will not be mandatory, but we will respect those who wish to continue wearing a mask or not. A one-way system will be encouraged. All of the downstairs doors could be used as exits and not just the main doors.
- The onus with the lifting of restrictions is upon each individual, we would therefore respectfully ask that **if you have cold or flu like symptoms** or have a temperature that you refrain from attending the worship service or entering the building.
- The main hall will have some chairs spaced out so that people may choose where they sit. People may move their chairs closer if they are part of a family or household group/ bubble.
- Singing will be encouraged. This may now happen without masks, although we will respect those who may continue to want to wear a mask. Everyone should be looking forwards when singing mitigating the risk of particles being widely spread. Those who may be more fearful may wish to sit/ stand nearer the back of the hall. The screen/ barrier can be removed.
- Communion will usually be served on the first Sunday of the month. The wine will be served in individual glasses and the bread prepared by a person who is wearing (Non latex gloves due to allergies). We respect there will be those who still wish to bring their own elements for communion.
- Laying on of hands. This could and should happen, but people should be asked if they would like this before it happens.
- Refreshments may be served after a service. When possible, this will be outside. There will be 2 or 3 allocated servers who will facilitate this. Paper cups will continue to be used on a Sunday morning. Mugs with handles are available for those who need a handle.
We were reminded by Lee Coleman last week of Gods teaching to the Israelites.
- **Who invented the three basic Covid rules to protect us? 1- Social Distance. 2 - Hand Washing hygiene. 3 - The Use of Mask. These laws were given to the nation of Israel 3,500 years ago. So look it up in the BIBLE ! 1 - Exodus 30: 18-21: Wash your hands so that they will not die. 2 - Leviticus 13:**

4, 5, 46: If you have symptoms, keep your distance, cover your mouth and avoid contact. 3 -
Leviticus 13: 4, 5: _Who is infected must remain in quarantine for 7 to 14 days. And there are still
those who doubt that the Bible is a book of wisdom!

Operation Christmas Child

It's time to start thinking about Operation Christmas Child and getting the gifts ready for our shoeboxes. I have been speaking with 2 or 3 people who have been busy knitting hats, gloves, and scarves, and also some simple toys and bags. Please will people consider buying some small items each week with their shopping that can be put into shoe boxes. For example: - bars of soap, flannel/ sponge, toothbrushes, combs, pencils, pens, notebooks, soft toys. other toys,

Things to avoid....is anything with liquid... so NO bubbles, shampoos etc... NO toothpaste, NO war related toys, YES to Books with pictures only or colouring books.

Last year we sent about 70 boxes from the church. Hopefully, we can do as well or better this year.

We are able to track the boxes and find out where they go. Last year our boxes went to a variety of places including Central Asia, Belarus, and Albania. Some of the children will never ever have received a gift in their lives.
